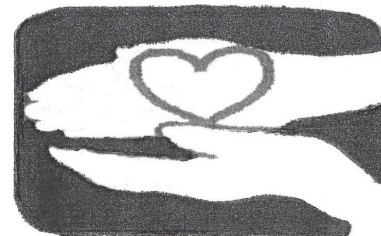

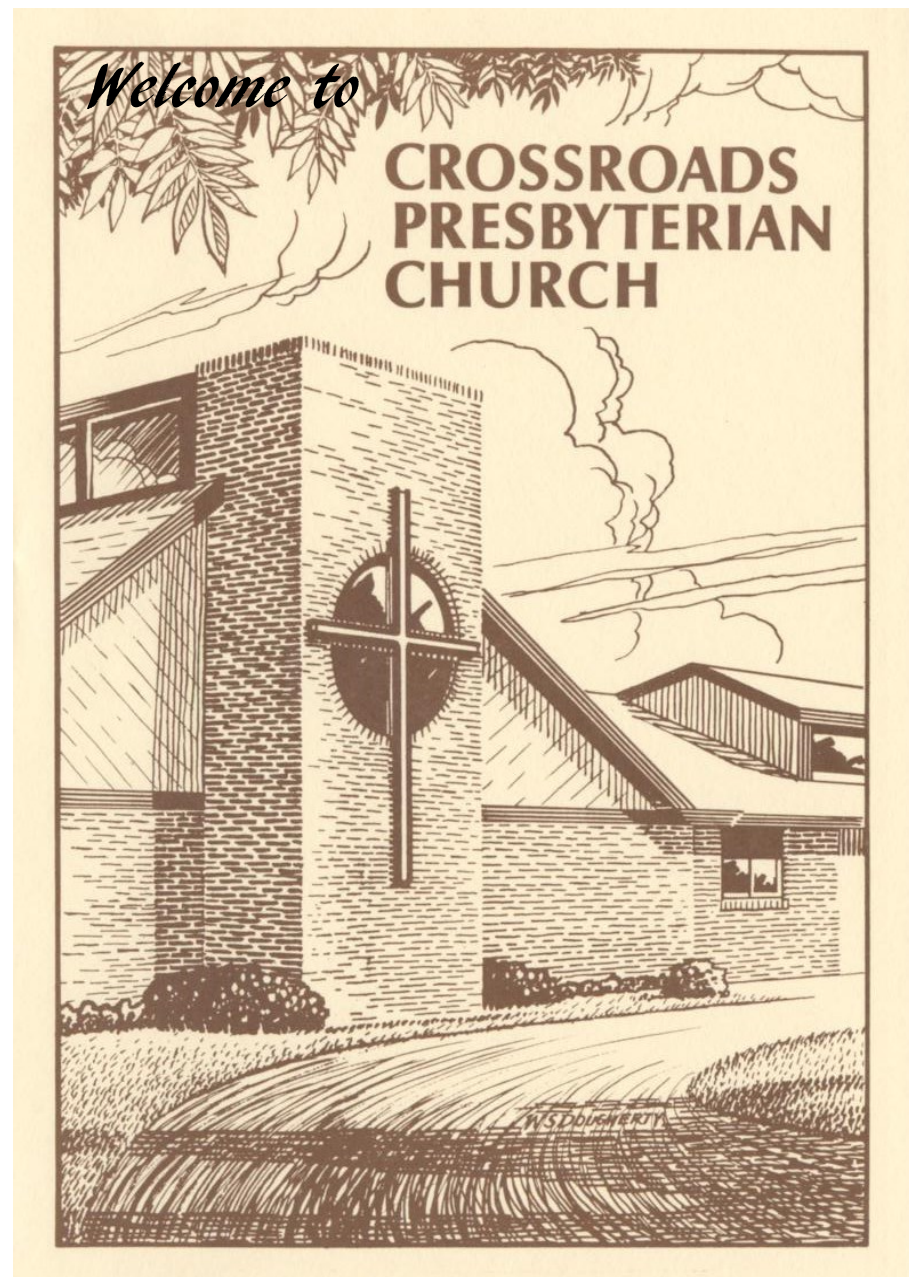

This past weekend, Super Bowl LII was played in Minneapolis, Minnesota. In addition to the high energy of both players and fans, there was a large amount of money being thrown around (distributed) at the game.

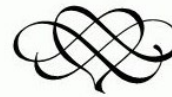
Or would it? :-)
