



The Pastor's Corner



To the Saints:

Not many of you keep up with the Presbyterian news. After all, why would you? But if you did, you would have found an interesting story this week.

The Presbyterian tradition is one that emphasizes written confessions of faith that arise when necessary. *The Book of Confessions* contains these confessions, beginning with the *Nicene Creed* (from 325). The most recent is over 30 years old. In these confessions, the church "declares to its members and to the world who and what it is, what it believes, and what it resolves to do."

When we ordain elders and deacons, we ask deacons and elders this question, "Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?"

I love the confessions of the church. In each one we see the church wrestling with its faith in a particular new context where it believes that faithfulness requires a fresh articulation of the church's commitments.

So, the news this week is that the Co-Moderators of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) have appointed a 16-member Special Committee to consider a new confession, whether we need one and to write one if it deems it appropriate for our current context. A lot has changed since 1991, and the General Assembly voted last summer to begin this multi-year process. Two people with some connections to Crossroads are on this Special Committee. My good friend Martha Moore-Keish, who teaches theology at Columbia Seminary, will serve. Martha has worshiped with us and has taught classes that several Crossroads people have taken. I have been invited to serve as well.

Whether a new confession emerges or not, it is a holy and welcome calling. I hope Crossroads will engage with me in this process.
